Comment Tag (makes what is commented visible but "non-working")

<!-- The comment tag starts with a bracket, an exclamation point, two dashes and a space. It ends with a space, two dashes and a bracket. -->

The paragraph tag <p> and its corresponding end paragraph tag </p>

The modifier to the <a> tag that allows a mail window to appear on the screen automatically addressed. Here is an example:

Email me!

The modifier to the table tag that sets the spacing between the cells of the table. Here is an example: <table cellpadding="30">

You can change the color of a font. Here is an example:

This text will be red.

You can also change the size of a font. The size of a font *increases* as the number increases (unlike a header which gets larger as the size of the number *decreases*.) Here is an example Bigger (size 6) text .

You can combine a font color change with a font size change. Here is an example: Changed color and size

You can create lists. One type of list is an unordered list.

You start with declaring an unordered list with the tag

Then you add list items in your list with the tag For example you may have a list of books and one entry may be The Sun Also Rises. As a list item it would be written The Sun Also Rises

When you have completed your list, don't forget to end your unordered list with the tag.

You can also underline words. I have underlined <u>In Praise of Famous Men</u> by using the underline tag.

You can also put words into italics. I have put <i>Ultimate Prizes</i> into italics with the italics tag.

You can combine the two tags to make something underlined and italicized. For example <u><i>Tigana. </i></u> You end the tags in the reverse order in which you applied them

You can also make something bold. For example John Strange and the bold tag can be combined with the italics tag, the underline tag, or any combination thereof.

Here is a complete example with this special note: The second item in the list has been made into a link. Note the <a> and tags.:

And don't forget the paragraph tag. <p> It ends with the end paragraph tag </p>

Remember that a header is bigger the smaller the number. <h1> produces a bigger header than <h2> etc.

 is a line break. Just like using enter in a word processing document
